## **Advent Prayer and Lighting of the Advent Wreath**

Reader: "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of

the Holiest of Holies, a new name for God.

People: Today we give thanks for the prophets among us, who bring to us surprising new visions

of hope, who challenge us to think outside the box, who show us a future we never

anticipated.

Reader: On this first Sunday of Advent, we light this candle as a symbol of the prophets who

renew our faith and remind us of what may be.

The first candle is lit.


